

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF SUBMITTING A APPLICATION TO THE WYOMING DEPARTMENT OF STATE PARKS AND CULTURAL RESOURCES FOR A 2014 RECREATIONAL TRAILS GRANT AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$50,000 TO SUPPORT TRAIL ENHANCEMENTS AT THE CIRRUS SKY TECHNOLOGY PARK

WHEREAS, the Recreational Trails Program supports a variety of trail projects;

WHEREAS, the first phase of the Cirrus Sky Technology Park project included the development of approximately 149 acres north of Laramie into four building lots and two outlots for trail and open space areas;

WHEREAS, the City's 2007 Comprehensive Plan details a Class 1 trail across the Cirrus Sky Technology Park, thereby connected 15th Street to 30th Street on the north perimeter of Laramie;

WHEREAS, the City Council appointed an Ad Hoc Advisory Committee to revise the Parks, Trails and Recreation Master Plan for the City and the Committee has included this trail connection within the new Parks Trails and Recreation Master Plan map;

WHEREAS, if awarded, the City will use Recreation Trails grant funds along with matching funds the City of Laramie for trail enhancements, such as small shelters, benches, historical markers and signage;

WHEREAS, through this project, the City of Laramie seeks to promote non-motorized transportation and to preserve, promote and expand Laramie's quality of life and resources.

NOW THEREFORE THE CITY COUNCIL OF LARAMIE, WYOMING, RESOLVES:

Section 1. That foregoing all recitals and incorporated in and made part of this resolution by reference.

Section 2. That the City Council supports the filing of an application to the Wyoming Department of State parks and Cultural Resources for a 2014 Recreational Trails grant in an amount not to exceed \$50,000 to support trail development and enhancements at the Cirrus Sky Technology Park
